



## **DAERA Stakeholder/Industry - Temporary ban on beef exports to the Philippines**

### **Temporary Ban on export of beef, beef products and live bovine animals to the Philippines**

Following the case of classical BSE confirmed in England on 17 September, the Filipino authorities have issued the 'Memorandum Order' in Annex 1 below, announcing a temporary ban on the import, into the Philippines, of cattle, beef and beef products from the UK. This was received in the early hours of Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October.

As you will see the 'Order' refers to a ban on all relevant exports from **4th October 2021**, therefore no Export Health Certificates can be signed from this date.

This ban will impact consignments in transit, however those consignments which contain product slaughtered and produced before, up to and including August 31<sup>st</sup> should still be able to be imported into the Philippines.

8055EHC for export of beef to the Philippines has been put on hold by APHA and DAERA, while certificates for the products listed below will only be issued once confirmed that they do not contain products of bovine origin.

- 8127EHC: blood products
- 9646EHC: hides
- 8076EHC: pet food

If you have exported such products containing beef to the Philippines in recent months, DAERA will contact you regarding these specific consignments. This is to help clarify whether your consignments will be impacted by the ban, and to ascertain next steps.

**MEMORANDUM ORDER**  
No. 60

**SUBJECT: TEMPORARY BAN ON THE IMPORTATION OF LIVE CATTLE, MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM CATTLE FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM**

**WHEREAS**, it shall be the utmost objective of the Government to protect its borders and territories from the entry, establishment and spread of animal diseases that may be introduced by the importation of disease-carrying, contaminated, and/or adulterated meat and/or meat products, which endanger the lives and safety/health of the consuming public and which could pose risk to human and animal health and life and potentially cause serious economic consequences;

**WHEREAS**, the veterinary authorities of the United Kingdom reported to the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) an outbreak of Classical Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) in the county of Somerset, South West England, United Kingdom which was reported on 17 September 2021;

**WHEREAS**, Classical BSE is a zoonotic disease which may pose a risk to consumers due to its link with the variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (vCJD) in humans;

**WHEREAS**, Section 10 of Republic Act no. 10611, or the "Food Safety Act of 2013", provided that *in specific circumstances when the available relevant information for use in risk assessment is insufficient to show that a certain type of food or food product does not pose a risk to consumer health, precautionary measures shall be adopted*;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM D. DAR**, Secretary, Department of Agriculture, by the powers vested in me by law, do hereby institute the following measures for the importation of meat and meat by products derived from cattle from the United Kingdom:

1. Temporary suspension of the processing, evaluation of the application and issuance of the Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Import Clearance of meat and meat by products derived from cattle including live cattle importation;
2. All shipments IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT before the official communication of this Order to the British Authorities shall be allowed **provided the slaughter and production date is on or before August 31, 2021**;
3. All previously approved SPS Import Clearances which were not yet IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT after the official communication of this Order to the British Authorities are hereby REVOKED;
4. Shipments with ship out date after the communication of this Order to the British Authorities shall be dealt with as per DA Administrative Order 9 series of 2010, Section VII.D;
5. More rigorous and tight inspection on all arrivals of meat and meat by-products derived from cattle including live cattle by DA Veterinary Quarantine Officers assigned at ports of entry.

This **ORDER** shall take effect immediately.
