• Reminder of Training Requirements for Official Certification

Purpose

To advise of definitions and new terminology for Private Veterinary Practitioners carrying out Official Activities on behalf of DAERA and a reminder of training requirements for Official Certification.

The implementation of new rules governing certification, Regulation EU 2017/625, on official controls and other official activities (OCR), has required a number of changes in the way that DAERA appoints veterinarians to act on their behalf and the terminology you may have been familiar with.

Any qualified and competent veterinarian who is responsible for delivering Official Controls or Official Activities must now be appointed and authorised for the task by DAERA, following assessment of their competence to complete the work to the required standards.

Constructive feedback suggests that the use of both old and new terminology, in recent training material produced to date, is causing confusion and further clarification is needed.

As it will take some time for all training materials and documents hosted on DAERA website to be amended to reflect the new terminology, please see the guide below which we hope you will find useful.

Authorised Veterinary Inspector (AVI)	A veterinary practitioner working in practice and authorised to carry out certification activities.	Authorised Private Veterinary Practitioners (aPVP)	Ireland) to perform Official Controls or specific designated Official Activities. An Official Veterinarian, working in private practice, authorised as a Certifying Officer (CO) to undertake specific categories of certification and authorised to sign certificates.
AVI Practice	A veterinary practice where the principal/director is an AVI. This allows veterinarians working there to become authorised as an AVI following completion of training.	Authorised Veterinary Practice (AVP)	A veterinary practice where the principal/director is an authorised PVP. Approval of Official Veterinarians as TB Testers

TB TESTING: The term 'approval' is used by TB programme to denote vets authorised to carry out TB testing. Vets carrying out TB testing will continue to be trained and approved in the same way as before. This approval allows private veterinary practitioners to complete work associated with the TB Contract but it does **NOT** authorise them to complete trade certification.

Authorisation of Official Veterinarians as Certifying Officers

TRADE CERTIFICATION: All veterinary surgeons wishing to carry out trade certification duties, e.g. pet passport, live animal export certificates, animal by-products certificates will be required to apply for **authorisation** and to undergo the relevant training on CAFRE Online (Moodle). This will require the completion of Module 1 – General



Certification and then other species / commodity specific modules as required. You can complete as many of the available modules as required.

Current available commodity/ species specific modules are:

- Module 2: Delivery of Support Health Attestations
- Module 5: Pet certification and Pet Passports

Additional courses in development include modules to cover the full range of products of animal origin and live animal species exported from Northern Ireland that require certification.

Action Required

Veterinarians wishing to continue to carry out current certification duties must complete Module 1 of the training by 19th November 2021. The DAERA Trade Bulletin 01/21 issued to private practitioners on 20 May 2021 contains further details about next steps to be taken and can be found here:

If you have not done so already please read and take the appropriate action, as failure to do so may result in cessation of current certifying officer status.

For those veterinarians with current certifying officer status for commodities for which on-line training is not currently available, additional commodity specific modules must be completed within 6 months of the module being made available via CAFRE Online. For those with a current authorisation to issue pet passports and pet certification, the Pet Module must also be completed by 19th November 2021. Please note that a pass mark of 80% on the knowledge review quiz is required to complete a module and demonstrate competence.
