1. General Information

- a) Person in day-to-day charge:** Person responsible (on permanent or temporary basis) for daily control of birds and aware of any production problems. Letters about the birds or bird disease will be addressed to this person. If there is a NIPHAS or an EC Egg Layer Establishment Registration Code (Egg Marketing Code) associated with the birds at this address, write it in the space provided.
- b) Place where the birds are kept:** If you do not keep birds at the address given at part (a) then enter the postal address of the production site, bird house or piece of land where the birds are kept. If there is a NIHPAS or an EC Egg Layer Establishment Registration Code (Egg Marketing Code) associated with the birds at this address, write it in the space provided.
- c) Herd/flock numbers for animals held by person in day-to-day charge of birds:** Complete all details as appropriate.
- d) Owner name and address:** *(If different from the keeper)* in case of urgent need for a responsible person to be contacted concerning the flock and the keeper cannot be contacted.

Zoo/Educational: Birds kept in a DAERA/NIEA licensed zoo or for educational purposes.

Stage in Chain *Tick all that apply:*

Grandparent breeder: Lay eggs that are hatched and the day olds are then grown on to become parent breeders.

Grandparent breeder rearer: Grows birds from day old which will become Grandparent breeders.

Parent breeder: Lay eggs that are hatched and either the day olds are grown on to produce eggs for human consumption or the day-olds are grown on to produce meat for human consumption.

Parent breeder rearer: Grows birds from day old that will become Parent breeders.

Broiler grower: Grows birds from a day old and then moves them on to be finished for human consumption by a broiler finisher.

Broiler finisher: Grows birds from day-old or older and finishes them for slaughter for human consumption.

Turkey Poult grower: Grows turkey poults and then moves them on to be finished for human consumption by a turkey finisher.

Turkey finisher: Grows birds from day-old or older and finishes them for slaughter for human consumption.

Commercial Egg layer: Hens that are laying eggs for human consumption.

Commercial Pullet rearer: Raises pullets from day old to point of lay.

Hatchery: Taking in eggs from parent/grandparent breeder flocks, sending out day-old birds or hatching eggs.

Rearer/Layer - other: Birds other than hens that lay eggs for human consumption. For example, ducks, quail.

Grower/Finisher - other: Grows young birds (other than broiler chickens or turkeys) and/or fattens birds (other than broiler chickens or turkeys) for human consumption. For example ducks, geese, quail.

Free Range: Complies with range requirements of EU Marketing Regulations and/or Organic Regulations.

Barn: Complies with Barn criteria in EU Egg Marketing Regulations or with Barn/Extensive Indoor criteria in EU Poultry meat Marketing Regulations.

Caged: Complies with Enriched Cage criteria in EU Egg Marketing Regulations.

Housed at all times: Live entirely indoors.

Partially housed: May be allowed access to open-air at certain times.
