BACKGROUND				
1. You will be aware of the context of the long-running Mobuoy illegal landfill case and of its				

trial commencing 19 September 2022. Due to the confirmed date of the funeral of Her

Majesty The Queen, this date will now be subject to change.

2.	The	prosecution	has taken	a case	against:

- Campsie Sand & Gravel (CS&G),
- · Director of CSG, Paul Doherty,
- City Industrial Waste Ltd. (CIW),
- Directors of CIW, Gerard Farmer, and Gerard O'Malley.
- 3. On 9 September 2022, one of the co-accused, Paul Doherty, entered a plea on all charges (bar one, which will be left on the books) in relation to the disposal, treatment and deposit of waste on his lands on the Mobuoy Road. All charges levelled against his company, Campsie Sand & Gravel Ltd, have been left on the books.
- 4. Sentencing has not yet taken place; this will follow in due course, along with Proceeds of Crime proceedings. A further hearing on Thursday 15 September 2022 has been entered into the Court diary, in which the other co-accused parties' defences have asked to review the case in light of the perceived consequences following Mr Doherty's guilty plea.
