With regard to your request for information received by the Department on 27 July 2022 which sought the following information:

- A full list of the Department's vehicle fleet, highlighting whether they are petrol/diesel/electric/hydrogen powered;
- What plans are in place to replace all of these vehicles to zero emissions versions, the anticipated cost and when the transition will be complete; and
- Whether any policy is in place or underway to encourage subcontractors to make the transition to zero-emissions vehicles.

I can advise that the Department has completed its search and can confirm that it holds the information you requested which is set out below.

Currently there are no plans in place to replace all of these vehicles to zero emissions versions as the commercial market conditions do not lend themselves to having products that meet the needs of the industry with value for money and effectiveness. However, when purchasing fleet the Department considers and completes an evaluation on each purchase to ensure that all options including electric and hybrid are considered to meet the business objectives of the request.

The Department has no policy in place or underway to encourage subcontractors to make the transition to zero-emissions vehicles.
