With regard to your request for information received by the Department on 3 February 2022 which sought the following information:

I can advise that the Department has completed its search and can confirm that it holds the information you requested which is attached as a separate document within this email.

The supply of information in response to a freedom of information request does not confer an automatic right to re-use the information. Similarly, information supplied can also be re-used for the purposes of news reporting. An exception to this is photographs.

If after such an internal review you are still unhappy with the response, you have the right to appeal to the Information Commissioner at Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, CHESHIRE, SK9 5AF, who will undertake an independent review of the Department's decision.
