The following Codes should be used.

This is a list of the most common breeds in Northern Ireland at present and will be revised by the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs as necessary.

However, if you require to record a breed not on the list, enter the name of the breed in full for the attention of the DVO. In the case of crossbreeds record only the dominant breed.

Males (i.e. steers and bull calves) should be recorded as M unless a bull calf is intended for breeding purposes in which case B should be used. All bulls over 6 months of age should be recorded as B.

Date of Birth Details

1. The exact date of birth must be entered for animals born in the herd.

Notes for Guidance - MC1



Cattle Identification (Notification of Births, Deaths and Movements) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1999.

In accordance with the above Regulations you are required to notify the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) of details of all births and deaths of animals in your herd.

1. BIRTH OF LIVE CALVES:

- All living calves, must be identified with an approved all-numeric tag in each ear, one of the tags being enabled for BVD sampling as follows:
 - Within 36 hours of birth in the case of a dairy herd; and
 - Within 20 days of birth in herds other than dairy herds.
- Births must be notified to the Department within 27 days of birth or before movement, whichever is the earlier, by using DAERA online services at www.daera-ni.gov.uk, by telephone, or by completing an MC1 form and submitting it to your local DAERA Direct Office.
 - Births not notified to DAERA within 27 days will result in an NNO status (No Notification of Birth) being applied to the animal on APHIS. This status restricts the movement of the animal, and may affect its eligibility for slaughter and subsidy payments.
- Cattle born on or after 1st March 2016 may not be moved off the farm without evidence of a negative BVD test result.
- Complete **Section A** for births on the MC1 form as shown below. **N.B.** you no longer need to enter the 6 digit herd number for each individual animal provided the herd number is entered at the top of the page in the appropriate place.
- Send the original (white copy) to DAERA & retain the second (yellow copy) for your own records.

- 2. ABORTED AND STILLBORN CALVES A stillborn is a calf that is born dead at full term or which dies within 24 hours of birth.
 - All aborted or stillborn calves must be identified with at least one approved all-numeric tag which must be enabled for BVD sampling.

 If not inserted in the carcass the second tag must be destroyed.
 - Complete **Section A** for **(births)** in the same way as for live births, but in addition:
 - Tick the box in the stillborn/aborted column.
 - Insert the date of death.
 - Enter the place of disposal and **A, B, C** or **D** for manner of disposal. (**A** = direct to renderer/incinerator, **B** = disposal via registered carcass collector, **C** = feeding to hounds at hunt kennels, **D** = veterinary laboratory for post mortem, or if not covered by A to D write in the place and manner of disposal).
 - Send the original (white copy) to DAERA & retain the second (yellow copy) for your own records.
 - N.B. Aborted foetuses and stillbirths must be notified to DAERA as soon as possible. In these cases, the dam may be tested for Brucellosis.

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3. DEATH OF CATTLE

- Deaths of cattle in the herd must be notified to the Department within **7 days** by submitting an MC1 form to your local DAERA Direct Office or by using the DAERA online services at www.daera-ni.gov.uk
- N.B. in addition, for animals which die aged <u>48</u> months or above, the operator of an approved TSE sampling site must be contacted by telephone within 24 hours of the animal's death.
- Complete Section **B** for **deaths** on the MC1 as shown below.
- Enter the place and **A**, **B**, **C** or **D** for manner of disposal. (**A** = direct to renderer/incinerator, **B** = disposal via registered carcass collector, **C** = feeding to hounds at hunt kennels, **D** = veterinary laboratory for post mortem, or if not covered by A to D write in the place and manner of disposal).
- Send the original (white copy) to DAERA & retain the second (yellow copy) for your own records.

A MC1, or DAERA on-line services, should be used to notify the death in all other cases.

N.B. a registered carcass collector, renderer, incinerator, hunt kennel or veterinary laboratory cannot make this notification on your behalf.
