This table is intended to provide valuations for broiler strains of table birds grown under contract to one of the major processors. It is NOT intended to be used for growers producing birds for direct sales from their own processing facilities.

The use of fast-growing broiler strains is assumed. Conventional broiler strains of table birds are white-feathered, although (very occasionally) some may have a proportion of brown feathers.

The table relates to broilers reared at a stocking density of up to 30kg/m² ('extensive indoor'). The birds are provided with a variety of enrichment devices e.g. straw bales, hanging objects to peck at etc. The majority of birds in this system are reared under the RSPCA scheme and to their standards. They are generally reared 'as-hatched' - i.e. males and females together in broadly equal numbers.

If the age of birds exceeds that given in the table, a pro-rata figure should be calculated using the last two valuation points to determine the daily increment.
