# The Animal Feed (Composition, Marketing and Use Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2016.

These regulations provide enforcement powers for Regulation (EC) 767/2009 on the placing on the market and use of feed.

**Regulation (EC) No 767/2009** prohibits any material being put into circulation for use as feeding stuff, or being used as a feeding stuff which contains packaging from products used in the agriculture or food industry.

Any person who contravenes these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and may be liable for prosecution.

This leaflet must not be used as a substitute for the legislation on which it is based.

#### Background

### Businesses supplying surplus food for feed must comply with feed hygiene requirements, such as:

- Food businesses where some of their production or by-products<sup>1</sup> from their processes go for animal feed use;
- Hauliers that transport these or any other animal feed materials;
- Businesses that store, supply or use animal feed materials.

## Examples of by-products (feed materials) from the food industry include:

Products derived from any part of a food production that are removed and designated for feed. Any products intended for use as human food but subsequently used in animal feed.

Bakery products

Pasta Products

- Dairy products
- Grain by-products
  - products Vegetable and fruit matter
- Confectionery products Biscuits
  - Pastry products

Ice-cream

### **Requirements:**

Registered and approved feed businesses are required to meet standards in respect of facilities, storage, personnel and recordkeeping, to ensure both feed safety and product traceability.

- Adequate facilities and equipment including acceptable storage and transportation that is protected from vermin, spoilage and contamination.
- Records relating to the source of the material and its movement within and from a business should be kept to ensure full traceability.

### Legislation

DAERA has responsibility for enforcement of all animal feed legislation in Northern Ireland.

### The Animal Feed (Hygiene, Sampling etc. and Enforcement) Regulations (NI) 2016.

These provide enforcement powers for **Regulation (EC) No.183/2005 (as amended)** which lays down the requirements for feed hygiene.

Feed hygiene Regulation (EC) No 183/2005 requires the registration or approval by all feed business operators with DAERA. *To request an application form please contact the number overleaf or visit <u>https://www.daera-ni.gov.uk</u> and search under 'animal feeds'.* 

### The Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010

All food businesses supplying surplus food for feed need to be aware of the Transmissible Spongiform Encephalopathies (TSE) Regulations which **prohibit animal protein to be fed to ruminants** (e.g. cattle, sheep and goats) and the feeding of processed animal protein to all farmed animals<sup>2</sup>.

Therefore, all businesses supplying surplus food for feed **must** have controls in place to prevent the presence of animal protein (e.g. meat) in feed.
